

SCOUTING POSITIONS CALLING LIST

This checklist contains a few **key points**, mainly dealing with the time involvement of the job. For a detailed job description, see the website indicated. Training is also available online at My.Scouting.org.

Note: A leader is considered trained when the following courses have been completed: Youth Protection and position-specific training, which includes Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS) for troop, team, and crew leaders.

Priests Quorum Advisor and Assistant Tasks (Venturing Crew)

First week

- Register with the BSA and take Youth Protection Training: my.Scouting.org
- Purchase or download [*Program Features for Troops, Teams and Crews*](#)
- Using *Program Features for Troops, Teams and Crews*, help the bishop's priest quorum assistants plan weekly meetings and activities

First month

- Help the priests quorum presidency make an annual plan using *Program Features for Troops, Teams and Crews* and [*Come, Follow Me*](#)
- Help the Bishop's assistants fill in each month of the annual calendar with detailed plans and assignments so they have always planned at least three months in advance
- Help the presidency select quarterly high adventure activities
- Assist parents in preparing young men for Melchizedek Priesthood ordination, missionary service, temple endowments and marriage
- Obtain and wear crew uniform (as chosen by the quorum)
- Attend crew committee meeting when held
- Attend monthly Scouting roundtable

First quarter

- Complete Venturing leader-specific training when offered by your stake or online any time at utahscouts.org/training
- Complete Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills when offered in your district
- When able, attend Wood Badge training

First week

- Register with the BSA and take Youth Protection Training: my.Scouting.org

- Using *Program Features for Troops, Teams and Crews*, help the quorum presidency plan weekly meetings and activities

First month

- Help the teachers quorum presidency make an annual plan using *Program Features for Troops, Teams and Crews* and [*Come, Follow Me*](#)
- Help the presidency fill in each month of the annual calendar with detailed plans and assignments so they have always planned at least three months in advance
- Help the presidency select a quarterly high adventure activity, including one long-term outdoor adventure
- Assist parents in preparing young men for Melchizedek Priesthood ordination, missionary service, temple endowments and marriage
- Obtain and wear team uniform (as chosen by the quorum)
- Attend team committee meeting when held
- Attend monthly Scouting roundtable

- Complete Varsity Vision leader-specific training when offered by your stake or online any time at utahscouts.org/training
- Complete Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills when offered in your district
- When able, attend Wood Badge training

First week

- ☑ Register with the BSA and take Youth Protection Training: my.Scouting.org

- ☑ Purchase or download [Program Features for Troops, Teams and Crews](#)
- ☑ Using *Program Features for Troops, Teams and Crews*, help the quorum presidency plan weekly troop meetings and activities at the green level.

First month

- ☑ Help the deacons quorum presidency make an annual plan using *Program Features for Troops, Teams and Crews*, [Duty to God](#) and [Come, Follow Me](#)
- ☑ Each month, help the presidency hold a patrol leaders' council (presidency and all patrol leaders) to fill in the detailed plans and assignments for weekly troop meetings
- ☑ Plan for monthly outdoor campouts or activities and at least one long-term camp during the year
- ☑ Assist parents in preparing young men for Melchizedek Priesthood ordination, missionary service, temple endowments and marriage
- ☑ Obtain and wear a Scout leader uniform
- ☑ Attend troop committee meeting when held
- ☑ Attend monthly Scouting roundtables

First quarter

- ☑ Help the presidency plan regular courts of honor
- ☑ Complete Boy Scout leader-specific training when offered by your stake or online any time at utahscouts.org/training
- ☑ Complete Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills when offered in your district
- ☑ When able, attend Wood Badge training

Primary Scouting

Eleven-year-old Scout Leader

- ☑ Register as an assistant Scoutmaster and take Youth Protection Training: my.Scouting.org
- ☑ Attend monthly deacons quorum presidency meeting (patrol leaders' council) with the 11-year-old patrol leader
- ☑ With your patrol leader, plan weekly patrol meetings to teach Scout skills that encourage 11-year-olds to progress toward First Class
- ☑ Plan three outdoor campouts during the year; if held, attend stake eleven-year-old Scout camp
- ☑ Assist parents in preparing boys for priesthood ordination
- ☑ Obtain and wear a Scout leader uniform
- ☑ Attend troop committee meeting when held
- ☑ Attend monthly Scouting roundtables
- ☑ Attend troop courts of honor with the eleven-year-old Scout patrol

Cub Scout Pack

Cubmaster and Assistant Cubmaster

- ☑ Register with the BSA; take Youth Protection
- ☑ Complete Cubmaster-specific training
- ☑ Attend monthly pack leaders' meeting
- ☑ Conduct monthly pack meeting
- ☑ Assist in annual calendar meeting
- ☑ Attend monthly Cub Scout roundtable
- ☑ Obtain and wear Scout leader uniform
- ☑ Help train den chiefs to work with den leaders

Webelos Den Leader and Assistant

- ☑ Register with the BSA; take Youth Protection
- ☑ Complete Webelos leader-specific training
- ☑ Conduct weekly Webelos den meetings to work on Webelos and Arrow of Light adventures
- ☑ Attend monthly pack leaders' meeting
- ☑ Attend monthly pack meeting to fill den duties
- ☑ Obtain and wear Scout leader uniform
- ☑ Attend Cub Scout day camp

Wolf and Bear Den Leader and Assistants

- ☑ Register with the BSA; take Youth Protection
- ☑ Complete Den leader-specific training
- ☑ Conduct weekly den meetings to work on adventures and advancement
- ☑ Attend monthly pack leaders' meeting
- ☑ Attend monthly pack meeting to fill den duties
- ☑ Obtain and wear Scout leader uniform
- ☑ Attend Cub Scout day camp
