3. Scout Oath and Law was repeated by the group, led by Bruce Teuscher.
4. Centennial Events
 1. Adventure Base 100 – September 24-25, 10am – 8pm each day. (See Flyer at end of this document.) Refer to <http://www.adventurebase100.org/> for more information. It will be held at the South Towne Mall parking lot.  2. Cornbelly's – throughout the month of October, celebrating 100 years of Scouting. Scouting units are offered a discount to attend. 5. Pinewood Derby – we did not see the numbers we expected (over 200 that raced cars), but it was a fun time. Real Salt Lake has sent a tape to Guinness for verification that this was the longest pinewood derby track. The track was over 300 feet in length.
6. There will be an “Influential Women in Scouting” recognition event later this year (October 22) at the Provo Library ballroom. Nominations for this are now closed for this year. Everyone is invited to attend.
7. Centennial Camporalls/Events: Jeralyn reports that she has still not heard back from any Sector chairs on upcoming events. The next event will be in Washington County – September 18. Details on this event is on the website at www.utahscouts.org.
8. Varsity Report: A Varsity Committee is holding an event next weekend at Tifie Scout Camp to discuss ideas, identify possibilities, etc. The date is September 17-18. People are still invited to attend.
9. Venturing Report: None.
10. Northern Utah 2010 Centennial Camporal:
 1. Still do not have enough Scouts registered. They would love to have 1000 additional Scouts. We currently have just fewer than 1000 Scouts registered (not including adults.) We have 1,232 registrations total.
 2. Need to get information out to the Scouts on what they need to bring (permission slips, pre-requisites, etc.)
 3. Discussed sign-ups. Youth can come with a parent if their Scouting unit does not plan to come.
 4. Are districts positioning this as the Fall Camporee replacement? Multiple districts reported that they are.
 5. Is this event being discussed at the District Committee Meeting? It should so that units can better understand what this is.
 6. Discussed event concerns:
 1. SCUBA BSA will be done at swimming pool at the Jr. High (cost reasons.) SCUBA (for Varsity/Venturing) will still be done at the Homestead.
 2. Randy Keys may be able to help on biking helmets – rakeys@utahscouts.org
 3. Some concerns on security (locking doors) for the historical display. They will plan on putting this in a trailer so that it can be lockable.
 4. Will there be tables and chairs at the event? Martin will have them there for use.
 5. We will have the ability to receive new registrations and will be able to accept cash, checks and credit cards.
 6. Trading Post hours – same hours as Merit Badge Midway (8:30 – 6 on Friday and 8:30 – 1:30 on Saturday)

7. Events can begin setting up on Thursday (anytime.) Contact Martin if you have questions.
 8. Leaders can also sign up for any of the events.
 9. The Wasatch County Recreation Center is available to anyone. The cost is \$2.50 for one day use.
11. This committee will not meet on October 13, but instead we will have a “Camporall Briefing” meeting on Wednesday October 6 at 7:00 p.m. at the Orem Service Center. All district volunteers participating in the Wasatch County Camporall are invited to attend.
12. The Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) has asked if our council would like to partner with them in providing service to needy families of deployed servicemen. They would identify needing families and verify that there is truly a need (such as shoveling walks, mowing lawns) and then send the information to the council. We would then work with the local district/unit to provide the actual service. The committee determined that this would be a very good thing to do.
