3. Centennial Events Report
  - a. Dan thanked those that participated in the Adventure Base 100
  - b. Upcoming Events
    - i. Cornbelly's Corn Maze at Thanksgiving Point during October
    - ii. BYU/UNLV game that will have special pricing and will be honoring Scouts on November 6th
    - iii. Influential Women of Scouting at the Provo Library on Oct 22
4. No further reports from the other sub-committees were in the interest of devoting the remainder of the meeting to the upcoming Centennial Camporall.
5. Centennial Camporall
  - a. The committee requested a report from John as to who has not paid their camporall fees, an updated registration summary, and a check-in report excel file.
  - b. Randy Mansfield presented a slide show as guide for the committee's discussion and plan for the camporall.
  - c. The check-in procedures were discussed by the committee and several challenges were identified, discussed and plan put into place.
    - i. Medical Forms will be collected at check-in and housed at the Trading Post for reference. Only parts A and C of the BSA Medical will need to be filled out for the camporall, unless a youth or leader is participating in Scuba, then a physical is also required.
    - ii. Units arriving at the event will be directed to park and the Senior Patrol Leader will be responsible for checking the troop.
    - iii. Camporee patches and ribbons will be handed out at check-in
    - iv. Permission slips for events that specifically require them will be collected at the point of entry for the event by a camporall staff member or bus driver. Boys that do not have signed permission slips cannot participate in the event.
  - d. Radios
    - i. Terry Gardner and Post 1973 joined the committee for the first time to provide radio communication support for the event.
    - ii. Where and who will have radio contact was discussed at length by the committee. Terry's preference is to use individuals with HAM Radios, but agreed with the suggestion that business band radio be deployed as a back-up. Terry committed to



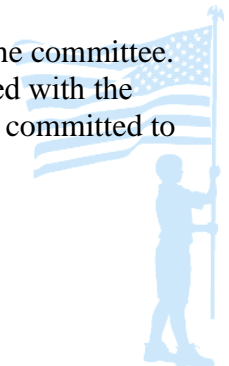

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contacting Lance Larson, who works with several of the council camps, about providing those.

iii. The procedure for communicating emergencies was discussed by the committee.

e. Service Project discussion

i. Randy Mansfield expressed his concern about the level of preparedness of this group. His concern was echoed by other members of the committee.

ii. The meeting location for the service project was established as the Rodeo grounds.

iii. A list of projects is being gathered and prepared.

f. Staff Meals

i. The cost of food ended up being double the cost than originally arranged. Due the increased cost, all meals for camporall staff will have a cost of \$2, which will be half the actual cost.

g. Trading Post

i. The Trading Post has been designated as the center of operations for the camporall and the check-in point for camporall staff.

h. Activities

i. A concern was raised that there were quite a few units that registered for the camporall and not for any events. The committee commented that the merit badges will be able to fill in the gaps for youth that will need something to do.

ii. The number and variety of Activities should be such that youth and leaders should have difficulty keeping busy.

iii. Randy emphasized the need for the competitive events to be sure to keep track of the units and boys that place in the various competitions. The scores will be calculated so that top youth and units can be awarded at the closing ceremonies on Saturday afternoon.

i. Toilets

i. The committee discussed at length the need or not for portable toilets. The standard for Scout camps would require that 80 toilets be available. This would include the flush toilets included at the event location.

ii. The need to have portable toilets in the sub-camps was discussed, but no decision was reached.

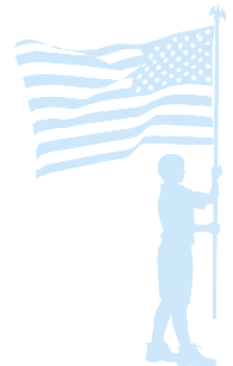
j. Transportation
